

CHAIR'S WELCOME

This year has been one of the most challenging ever for the film industry in Wales and globally. The COVID-19 pandemic immediately drew the majority of production to a halt, closed our cinemas and left many training and education providers having to quickly adapt to an online world of provision.



Ffilm Cymru Wales has worked tirelessly to support the film sector during these challenging times. We are a value-driven company, committed to ensuring that Wales' film sector flourishes and is open to all.

These values were the driving force behind Ffilm Cymru's rapid pivot to address the sector's need in the first half of 2020-2021. This included allocating £50,000 in Emergency Relief Funds for writers, directors, producers and film education providers, whilst also advocating for and informing Welsh Government's vital Cultural Recovery Funds for cinemas and freelance support that followed.

A sustainable, thriving film industry in Wales is only possible if our talented film production companies are able to innovate and grow. That is why Ffilm Cymru offers targeted company support to our SMEs and why we also required that our company support rippled out to our freelance community. Our values also drove us to review and amend where we keep our funds as we moved our accounts to the Co-Op Bank which enjoys a longstanding reputation for ethical banking.

But the support Ffilm Cymru offered this year was not only financial. In the isolation of the pandemic, the regular personal and group conversations with cinemas and festivals enabled Ffilm Cymru to be active listeners to our exhibition and education sectors and in so doing to be better informed advocates for the support they need.

The pandemic was not the only driver of change this year. The film industry globally is rightly challenged for its track-record on equality, diversity and inclusion. Ffilm Cymru continued to invest in inclusive skills and training that gives opportunities to people who may never have thought of a career in film a vital foot in the door. We revisited our Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Plan, which has directly shaped our current recruitment of new Board members. And Ffilm Cymru played a vital advisory role in Clwstwr's ScreenWork2020 report that identified the skills and training needs of the screen sector in the Cardiff Capital Region including the scale of change needed to make our screen sector a genuinely inclusive place to work.

As I write this report, the UK is preparing to host the United Nations Global Climate Change Summit (Cop26). Ffilm Cymru is determined to support our sector in bringing about meaningful change. We welcome our newly appointed Green Manager, Chris Hill who leads our Green Challenge programme in supporting screen sector professionals and companies to achieve net-zero carbon emissions by 2050. This year we established a Green Challenge Fund in partnership with Clwstwr that will help fund research and development to identify innovative ways our film sector can go green and get clean and we have already leveraged this with scale-up funds secured through the successful Media.Cymru partnership bid, led by Cardiff University, which is backed by Welsh Government's Creative Wales and UKRI Strength in Places. Those funds will come onstream in 2022.

I am deeply grateful to the Ffilm Cymru Wales Board and the entire Ffilm Cymru Wales team for their considerable work this year. They have demonstrated unwavering commitment, flexibility and energy in supporting a film sector in Wales that we can all be proud of. This is a sector that above all needs an audience so I hope that we can all once again enjoy the pleasure of going to the cinema to watch the remarkable range of films supported by Ffilm Cymru Wales.
